I have a lot of credit to give to Rogers and this Foundation, who aided me in being the person I never thought I could be.

My battle with OCD started when I was a baby. My mother had severe harm OCD, and I never understood her suffering. Well, now I know!

My journey started while I was pregnant in March of 2020. I was diagnosed with gestational diabetes, and during this time, I began to have intrusive thoughts. I convinced myself it was hormones, it would go away.

In November, I gave birth to a baby girl, Aurora. She was my light, my new reason to live. But the birth itself came with complications that could have caused us to lose our lives.

A week later, I ended up in the hospital due to my blood pressure, and I remember telling my mom, "Mom, I think I have OCD, like you."

The OCD progressed to the point where I protected my daughter from everything, and I was convinced I was dying. Every sensation in me became a reason for illness with the worst possible outcome.

Then, one day, I went to the zoo with my family. My daughter wanted to ride on the carousel, which I refused to do because it was too scary and dangerous. So, I watched my husband and mom ride on the carousel with my daughter while I sobbed.

In that moment I realized, I couldn't be the mom I wanted to be. I had two choices - and one of those choices was NOT an option. Instead, I decided to fill out an intake form at Rogers.

I threw myself into the program! About 4 weeks in, insurance denied my treatment. I cannot explain how I felt, knowing that I would be going to go back to the exact life I had before, and I could NOT live like that again. Immediately, my therapist and others helped me apply for a Patient Care Grant, and I was approved!

With the grant, I worked as hard as possible and completed my program. My soul felt like someone had unlocked it. I felt so free!
